

**Area Lighting Service****Availability**

Available on a year-round basis for dusk to dawn the delivery of kilowatt-hours for area lighting, subject to the established rules and regulations of the Cooperative.

**Term of Service**

The term of service under this schedule shall be by contract for an initial period of at least three years and on a continuing basis thereafter.

**Rate****Normal Service:**

Normal service is defined as service with aerial feed not more than 150 feet in length using the Cooperative's standard luminaries, lamps and brackets not more than four feet in length installed on existing wooden distribution system poles.


**Adjustment Clauses**

Area Lighting Service

Additional Charges

Special, non-standard brackets longer than four feet will be installed upon request at a charge dependent upon the length and installed cost of the bracket.

When service is provided that requires facilities that are standard with the Cooperative but are in excess of the cost of those facilities furnished under normal service, an additional monthly or one time charge for such excess facilities will be made.

Conditions of Service

All area lighting equipment, including lamps, fixtures, photo-electric controls and necessary secondary circuits, poles, guys and fittings will be furnished, installed and maintained by the Cooperative.

Normal lamp replacements will be made by the Cooperative without additional charge, except that any damage to lamps and luminaries resulting from vandalism shall be charged to the customer, at cost, as a separate item on the monthly bill for service. Outages should be promptly reported.

Maintenance and lamp replacement will normally be performed only during regularly scheduled working hours of the Cooperative. For its convenience and at its option, the Cooperative may perform maintenance and lamp replacement at other times.

If an existing pole is not used, the Cooperative will install a wooden pole suitable size. The charge for this pole will be \$50.00 at installation plus \$3.50 per month.

When a customer requests a change in existing area lighting equipment that has not reached the end of its normal useful life, the customer will be required to pay for any relocation costs of the equipment. When a customer requests the discontinuation of the use of street lighting equipment prior to expiration of the TERM OF SERVICE, the customer will be required to pay either the balance due on the contract, or the installation and removal cost of the equipment, whichever is less.

Terms of Payment

The above rates are net. Payment of the current monthly bill shall be made within 25 days from the date of mailing. In the event that the bill is not paid within the 25-day period, the charges become subject to a late payment charge as established in the Terms and Conditions.
